#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Glascote Academy is a converter academy which is part of the Fierté Multi Academy Trust along with Ankermoor Primary Academy, Dosthill Primary Academy, Heathfields Infants Academy, Wilnecote Junior Academy, Anker Valley Primary Academy, and Manor Primary Academy in Tamworth, and Violet Way Academy and Edge Hill Junior Academy in Burton.

Glascote Academy is in Glascote Heath, a suburb of Tamworth. The school is on a large site and the original two buildings are joined by an internal corridor to make one safe environment which is accessible to everyone. The mobile, which is at the front of the site, is used by the Glascote Heath Nursery and Care Club which is part of Our Pride, Our Joy (a subsidiary company of Fierté Trust).

The school caters for pupils between the ages of 4 and 11 years and serves mainly the Glascote Heath and Amington areas, although it now has many more pupils from the surrounding area.

# **ADMISSION OF CHILDREN**

The school Pupil Admission Number (PAN) for this school for is 30. If the number of pupils seeking admission to the school exceeds the number of places available, then the following order of priority will be used:

Pupils living within a catchment area of the school

Pupils who in the first year of admission have an elder brother or sister in attendance at the school

Pupils who satisfy both of the following:

- a. they are distinguished from the majority of other applicants either on medical grounds, which are supported by a medical report obtained by parents, specifying the medical advantage of the child attending the preferred school compared with the normal catchment area school, or by other exceptional circumstances material to the choice of the school
- b. they would suffer hardship if they were unable to attend the school.

Other pupils are arranged in order of priority, taking into account such factors as proximity of their home address to the school

If the capacity of the school allows, we may on occasions offer two classes. There is only one intake, which is in September, for children who are aged four years before August 31<sup>st</sup>.

Parents are invited to meet the class teacher, Early Years Leader, and Headteacher. At this meeting, the school's approach to the Early Years Curriculum will be explained and, as we try to involve all parents in the educating process, it is hoped that we can show how everyone can help and support their child's work.

#### PARENTS AS PARTNERS

At the Glascote Academy, we value the support and co-operation of our parents and during the induction programme for new entrants there is always a great emphasis on the importance of liaison between parents and staff.

We view parents as valuable partners and are pleased to offer the opportunity to come into school for termly Inspire Workshops, Family Lunch, Class Assemblies, Achievement Assemblies, special occasions including Harvest, Christmas, Easter, Easter Chocolate Bingo, and our Christmas Fayre.

# **Reporting to Parents**

Parent interviews are held regularly across the year and involve the teacher and parents. At this time, targets, attainment and progress are discussed. A written Annual Report is produced in the summer term and parents are invited to discuss this should they so wish to.

If for any reason you need to see the class teacher or Headteacher at any other time, you are always welcome to come into school at a mutually convenient time. We would ask, however, that this does not encroach on teaching time.



# SCHOOL DRESS CODE

Our school uniform policy has been shared with all parents. Pupils wear navy blue sweatshirts or cardigans, white shirts and school tie which matches the child's House Team Colour. Skirts and trousers in either black or grey are preferred. Boots can be worn to school and then changed for black, low heeled school shoes. Tights are black, grey or navy. Further information is on our website.

All children in the school wear uniform and we are proud of how smart they look.

ALL children will need warm old clothing, including wellies, for their Farm/Forest sessions.

#### **Jewellery**

Children are not to allowed to wear jewellery, except a watch and stud earrings if necessary, or items of religious importance. Sleepers or hoop earrings should not be worn for Health and Safety reasons. **All jewellery must be removed for P.E.** If earrings cannot be removed for medical reasons the child will only be able to participate in the parts of the lesson that are thought to be safe for the child and other children.

# ORGANISATION AND PASTORAL CARE

#### **Medicines**

If it is necessary for a child to receive medicine at school, we ask that you sign a form of authorisation, which must include details of requirements. All medicines must be carefully labelled with the child's name and in their original packaging. These will be kept in a safe place and administered when necessary.

#### **Lunchtime Arrangements**

Our Catering Staff take great pride in serving a varied and nutritious meal at lunchtime. Our children use crockery rather than plastic trays. All meals and snacks are to be paid for via Parent Pay.

Children who bring sandwiches are responsible for putting their lunch boxes in the place indicated by their teacher. Lunchboxes should not contain sweets and must be of a healthy nature i.e. sandwiches, fruit, vegetable sticks etc. Please do not send glass containers or knives to school as these may pose a hazard.

It is expected that children will respond as positively to our Lunchtime Supervisors as they would to any other member of staff. They deal with all lunchtime matters, including first aid, although staff are always on hand, should the need arise.

Each term we have Family Lunchtimes, where parents/grandparents/friends of the children in a particular class are invited to share a meal with them.



# **Absences and Holidays**

Children are expected to arrive from 8:40am with registers opening at 8:50am and closing at 9.00 am. If a child arrives after 8:50, a L code is given whereas a U code (unauthorised) will be given from 9:10am. We expect parents to notify school if their child is ill and unable to attend.

#### **Absence Requests**

The National and Local ruling for holidays during any academic year is that a child is **not allowed holidays during term time**. We believe it is essential children attend as much as possible so that they do not miss out on their learning.

#### **Unauthorised Absence**

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider to be reasonable and for which no leave of absence has been given. These include:

parents keeping children off school unnecessarily

truancy before or during the school day

absences which have never been properly explained

children who arrive at school too late to get a mark

If your child is absent from school for any reason, we obviously would expect you to let us know as soon as possible. However, if the school does not hear from a parent, it will contact the home on the first day of absence. This will ensure that the parents are aware that their child is not in school and also for them to provide a reason for his/her absence. If, however, the school is not able to contact the parents and a reason for the absence has not been given by either phone or email, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Parents whose children are experiencing difficulties should contact the school at an early stage so that the problem can be resolved together.

If the difficulties cannot be sorted out in this way and/or the child's attendance does not improve, the Local Authority may issue a Penalty Notice, which are fines or use court proceedings to prosecute parents. Please see our Trust Attendance Policy.

# THE CURRICULUM

At Glascote Academy, we follow The 2014 Curriculum which is delivered in a series of topics/themes across the year. In Reception, the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework is adhered to.

The subjects that form the National Curriculum are:

English

Mathematics

Science

Computing

History

Geography

D.T. (Design and Technology

Art Art

P.E. (Physical Education)

PSHE/RSE

Music Music

R.E. (Religious Education)

A balanced creative curriculum is provided to encourage sound learning and to promote the academic, social, spiritual, moral, cultural and physical development of each child according to his/her capabilities.

Computing is a high priority within the school and therefore computing equipment is regularly upgraded. There is a well-equipped Computer Suite and each teaching area has an Interactive Whiteboard to enhance teaching and learning across the curriculum. The school also has the use of Chrome books which can be used in the classrooms for group work. The internet and the school network can be accessed from all computers.

Each class also receives weekly Music lessons delivered by "Rock-it" Music Services. The children learn to play steel pans, keyboards, drums, and Ukuleles. Both Year 2 and Year 6 pupils are entered for a London College of Music examination during the Summer Term. All children perform in music concerts for Parents.

Every term, all classes access both the Forest and the Farm. We strongly believe that these unique outdoor areas offer a wealth of learning opportunities and allow children to learn important life skills such as managing risks and teamwork.

#### **Health Education**

Throughout the school, health education is taught as part of the curriculum. Sex Education appropriate to the age and maturity of the child is delivered as part of the Science Curriculum and RSE Curriculum.

# **Religious Education**

In accordance with the Education Act 1988, Religious Education is a compulsory part of the curriculum. The teaching of RE in the School, follows the Agreed Syllabus for Staffordshire which enables the children to learn about different aspects of particular religions:

Christianity

Islam

Hinduism

Judaism Judaism

**Buddhism** 

Parents have the right to ask for their child to be withdrawn from Religious Education. However, parents may wish to discuss this matter with the Head Teacher before this decision is made, as they may find that the school's approach does not conflict with their own.

# **Collective Worship**

Collective Worship is mainly of a broadly Christian nature. The weekly pattern of worship is either whole school, key stage or class assemblies and these are led by the Headteacher, member of staff or occasionally by a visiting speaker.

During the term, Class Assemblies are held where parents of the children involved in the assembly are invited to come into school to see their presentation of the work they have covered in school.

Parents have the right to ask for their child to be withdrawn from collective worship, but this matter should be discussed with the Headteacher.

#### Sport

The school has a large sports field. All Y6 children have swimming sessions for the whole of the academic year. Qualified instructors teach them swimming and water safety skills. A residential environmental week is also offered to Year 6.

#### Homework

It is expected that parents will encourage and help their children's progress by hearing them read at home regularly.

In addition, children will have set tasks to complete at home. This will include work in CGP books for Maths, Comprehension or GPS, learning their times tables, competing them based projects.

Homework for some children requires a self-discipline that they find elusive. We would be grateful if parents would ensure that work is completed and returned appropriately.

#### Inclusion

The mission statement of our school talks of valuing the individuality of all of our children. We are committed to giving all of our children every opportunity to achieve the highest of standards. We do this by taking account of pupils' varied life experiences and needs. We offer a broad and balanced curriculum and have high expectations for all children. The achievements, attitudes and well-being of all our children matter. This ensures that the school promotes the individuality of all our children, irrespective of ethnicity, attainment, age, disability, gender or backgrou

# Rules and discipline

It is the aim of the school to foster the child's ability to exercise self-control. To support behaviour, we use "Emotional Coaching" and relaxation stations to encourage the children to self-regulate in order to access learning. Pupils are encouraged to accept responsibility for his/her own behaviour and to appreciate that all behaviours have consequences. We welcome the support of the parents in maintaining a high standard of behaviour within the school.

**Bullying of any description is not tolerated at the school**, and every effort is made to ensure that any incidents are dealt with promptly. House Captains, Student Governors, and Ambassadors support children whilst in the lunch hall and on the playground.



#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

#### **Complaints Procedure**

In all matters relating to the curriculum and all other aspects of school life, every effort is made to meet the needs of the pupils. If a complaint should arise, a complaints procedure, approved by the Trust may be followed.

Many problems are best resolved by discussion with the class teacher

If a parent feels that the outcome of these discussions is unsatisfactory, then the issue may be discussed with a member of the **Senior Leadership Team** and/or the **Headteacher** 

If this still proves unsatisfactory, then the Governing Body will become involved and the complaint will be referred to the **Chair of Governors.** 

If all these investigations fail to provide a satisfactory outcome, the parent has the right to refer the complaint to the **CEO of Fierté MAT.**
