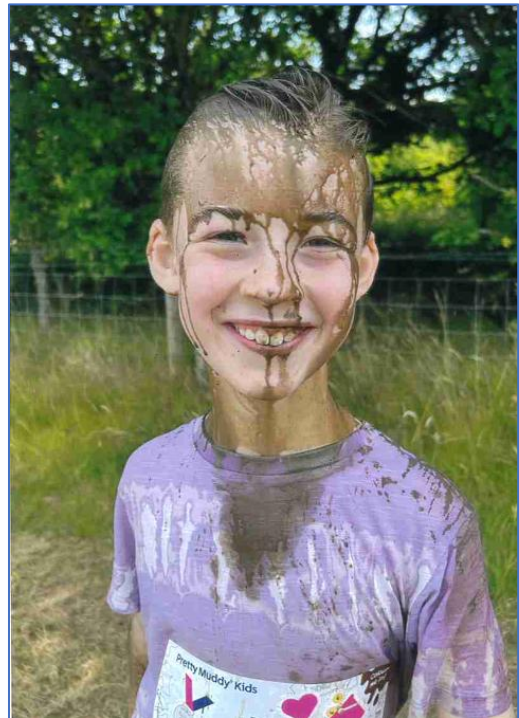
Special mention:
